- Demographic change

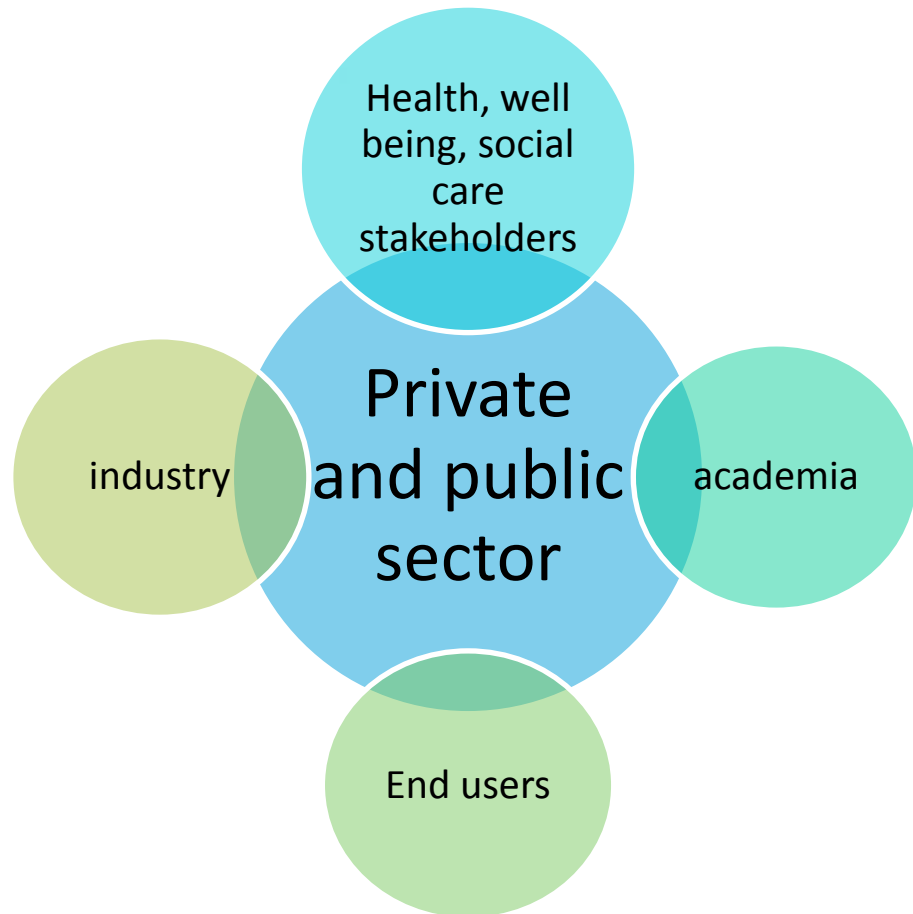

Agenda

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eHealth Network (Art 14 of Directive 2011/24/EU)

- The **eHealth Network** is a voluntary network connecting national authorities established by article 14. Its role is to :
- Foster cooperation and exchange of information between MS to ensure EU wide interoperability of electronic health systems, high level of trust and security, continuity of care and access to safe, high-quality healthcare, sustainable economic and social benefits of European eHealth systems.
- Specifically, the network is expected to draw up **guidelines**:
- On the minimum set of common data to be included in **patient summaries** to be transferred across borders;
- Methods to enable **medical information** use for public health & medical research;
- Common **identification and authentication** measures to ensure transferability of data in cross-border healthcare.

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eHealth Action Plan 2012-2020

The Action Plan attempts to improve healthcare by:

- Increasing **awareness** of the benefits and opportunities of eHealth and **skills** among patients and healthcare professionals;
- Clarifying areas of **legal uncertainty** for eHealth;
- Improving **interoperability** between systems and eHealth services;
- **Empowering** citizens, patients and healthcare professionals;
- Supporting **research, innovation** and the development of a **competitive European market**;

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Telemedicine

Telemedicine and remote monitoring to address the rise of chronic conditions, the ageing population, the shortage of healthcare professionals and healthcare rising costs.

Interoperability

Overcome fragmentation of the eHealth market by use of existing standards and interoperable solutions. Projects/ networks/legislation to support interoperability: CEF, epSOS, etc.

mHealth

Fast growing uptake of tablets/smartphones, the eHealth Action Plan also focuses on mhealth.

International Cooperation

EU-US COOPERATION : The EU and USA a Memorandum of Understanding focusing on interoperability and IT skills of the healthcare workforce.
