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

Obesity and chronic disease


- Diabetes

– up to 80% preventable and huge burden of chronic disease care.



What we know now

- Childhood obesity is 3 times more common in the lowest socioeconomic group by age of 3 years
- Significant discrimination in healthcare and employment opportunities
- Experience with bariatric surgery in children increasing

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What we know now

- Sedentary time is the 4th highest ranked preventable cause of death

“Lack of activity destroys the good condition of every human being, while movement and methodical physical exercise save it and preserve it.”






What we now know:

- Obesity causes immune deficiency
- Defense against weight loss is stronger and more conserved than defence against cancer and infection
- The immune deficiency in turn drives weight gain – classic vicious cycle

Changes in innate immune cells and altered function present in obese children.




What about response to vaccination?



- Impaired responses also for tetanus in obese children
- Risk that communicable disease may be increased by obesity

The EU action plan:

- Area 1: Support a healthy start in life
- Area 2: Promote healthier environments
- Area 3: The healthy option, the easy option
- Area 4: Marketing and advertising to children
- Area 5: Inform and empower families
- Area 6: Encourage physical activity
- Area 7: Monitor and evaluate
- **Area 8: Increase research**


The child's view of obesity

‘Ils me vanner parce que je reçois rouge et en sueur’




The child's view of obesity
